- 1.) Make a drawing of the object itself; close up, with as much detail as possible. If you are drawing a painting, or other piece of flat art, include the frame, and pay attention to the height/width proportions.
- 2.) Make a second drawing, on the back of the first one, that shows the object in context, and how it is displayed. Is it hung with a few other paintings on the wall? Is it in a case with other objects? Is it on a pedestal, free standing? (15%)
